Why should I apply for the ESGVJCC Queen Coronation? It is an amazing

as well as unique opportunity. Some of our past

Queens have described it as a "once in a lifetime opportunity." You will improve your interpersonal and social skills and after the year you will notice how your confidence and self perception have become more mature and thoughtful. If chosen ESGVJCC Queen, you will get to represent your greater community, the ESGVJCC, and your family and friends as our Nisei Week candidate.

If I participate, what should I expect?

The ESGVJCC Queens Committee will work with each candidate to help hone their poise and speaking abilities, as well as confidence both on stage and off to help prepare you for Nisei Week candidacy. We've seen past candidates go through a significant personal growth as a result of their participation in the queen selection. The ESGVJCC court will be introduced at each of our events and asked to participate and interact with our members. Through this experience you can expect to gain a greater appreciation for volunteerism, giving back to the community, and growth in your relationships with ESGVJCC members.

I'm shy/timid — should I still apply?

Absolutely! No one is born a public speaker and the training will help you be the best you can be. Sometimes the most shy person is the one who shines the most because they have utilized the training and really embraced the opportunity to build on skills they already have.

I'm in school or have a job—will I still be able to do this?

Yes! It's up to you if you would like to be a part of this wonderful experience, and if you manage your time and prioritize your commitments then it's completely possible. It's not always easy and it will take some juggling, but if you're willing to make it happen, it will all be worth it!



What if I don't know a lot about my Japanese heritage?

While having knowledge of the Japanese culture and language is beneficial, it is not mandatory. This is the perfect opportunity for you

to learn more about who you are and where you came from. Through this experience, you will learn more about your culture—like Japanese tea ceremony, dressing in kimono, karate, Japanese language, JA history, ikebana, and much more. There are many opportunities to join an ESGVJCC program to further enhance your knowledge and experience of the Japanese culture for your own personal growth.

How much will it cost?

To become a candidate you must be an ESGVJCC member and there is a \$25 application



fee. Candidates will participate in our Coronation and may need to purchase appropriate attire.

If you're chosen to be ESGVJCC Queen then you will go on to be a Nisei Week candidate and your registration fee will be sponsored by ESGVJCC. Though Nisei Week receives many donations to support the queen and court, there may be additional costs for travel, attire, appreciation (omiyage) and other incidentals. We will have a more detailed breakdown for you at Orientation.



What kind of time commitment will this take?

Your participation as ESGVJCC Queen and or a member of the Nisei Week court is

a time commitment as well. ESGVJCC Court members have a one year commitment and ESGVJCC Queen has one additional year commitment to the organization. Over this time, you will learn the importance of time management and how to balance your personal affairs, school and/or work affairs, and your commitment to ESGVJCC (and Nisei Week). However, you will only get as much out of the experience as you put into it, so we highly recommend you commit yourself as fully as possible in order to gain the most from the experience. This is a oncein-a-lifetime opportunity you would not be able to find elsewhere.

Is this a typical "beauty pageant"?

No. Being selected ESGVJCC Queen and Nisei Week candidate is not like your typical beauty pageant. Candidates are chosen based on their poise, speaking ability, community service and desire to learn more about their Japanese heritage. Court members act as cultural ambassadors

representing the greater San Gabriel Valley community as well as ESGVJCC and its many programs.



If chosen Queen, what should I expect?

If you are chosen ESGVJCC Queen and our Nisei Week Candidate you will be invited to travel to Japan, Hawaii, and San Francisco as a representative of the Southern California Japanese

American community. You will meet influential people both locally and abroad such as community and political leaders and even celebrities and public figures.

You will continue to see growth in your public speaking abilities as you meet and converse with people from all walks of life at different events. You will witness the selfless giving of many community members as they work to make your year as memorable as possible as they "roll out the red carpet" for you and the court members.

Our hope is that you gain a greater sense of your heritage and involvement in the Southern California Japanese American community as a result of your participation in the Nisei Week Court, and that after your year is over, you continue to give back to the both the greater Southern California JA community, and more importantly, to the ESGVJCC.

When is the best time to apply?

Some people recommend that age 20 to 21 (around college graduation) is a great time to apply because many girls feel they have a bit more direction in their life and have had more life experience. However if you're between the ages of 19-25, are motivated, feel you will be able to accommodate the time commitment and are ready to seize an opportunity, then apply! We have had candidates that are ages 19 or 20 as well as 24 and 25.

QUALIFICATIONS

• Applicant must be at least 19 years old and not older than 25 years old (or 26 years old pending Nisei Week Foundation approval) on the day of the Nisei Week Coronation in August 2023

• Applicant must be of at least 50% Japanese ancestry.

• Applicant must have been born or naturalized in the US as a permanent resident, never married and without children.

• Applicants may be engaged, but if crowned ESGVJCC Queen, she must remain unmarried for the duration of her reign.

• Applicant must be an ESGVJCC member.

• If applicant is crowned ESGVJCC Queen, she will represent ESGVJCC as a candidate for Nisei Week Queen and will remain active throughout her reign as well as one additional year. **Application Fee:** \$25 (If applicant is not a member in good standing then membership dues are also required at time of application. Membership dues are \$50.)

Application Deadline: January 31, 2023

I understand the requirements that are being asked of me and that I must be available for training during February, March and April. I also understand that I must not enroll or participate in any other beauty or popularity contests or apply with any other Nisei Week Queen sponsor/organization until the end of the 2023 Nisei Week Festival.
